# **N.Z Super Eight Schools Tennis**

### **BACKGROUND**

Formed in 1997, the New Zealand Super Eight Schools incorporates the eight boys' high schools from their respective provincial cities of the central North Island.

The first competitions were sponsored by Canterbury Clothing Company of NZ and commenced in 1998 involving rugby and cricket. Since that time the New Zealand Super Eight Schools concept has grown to include not only 14 sports competitions but also a cultural festival and professional development programmes for senior management staff and curriculum teachers.

The schools individually and collectively reflect a traditional ethos of education, which relates to their long histories as cornerstones of education in their regions. Old boys have a prominence across New Zealand's society as: University academics and educators, senior business managers, professionals and entrepreneurs, civic leaders and politicians, and as sport and cultural icons.

Today the **New Zealand Super Eight Schools** are synonymous with excellence in education, innovation in management and outstanding performance on stage and the sports field. The management of the schools' group is rotated on an annual basis and school leaders meet twice a year to establish priorities, discuss initiatives and set guidelines for the ensuing year.

# **TOURNAMENT RULES**

### 1. Team Composition:

Each team will consist of four players. A substitute may also be used but must play in the number four position. Seeding's and the draw will be completed by the host school and are based on configure rankings for the top 4 players in each team.

### 2. The Format

- a. Four singles and two doubles matches to be played.
- b. Singles matches are to be the best of three tie-breaker sets.
- c. A 12 point tie-breaker shall be played at 6-6 in each set.
- d. The I.T.F short deuce rule shall be in effect in doubles only, with a super tie break third set. (This states that one determining point shall be played in each game when deuce is reached).
- e. Singles players must play in ranked order, that is, if the reserve is used, the reserve goes into the No 4 seed and other players must stay in their ranked order. For example, if the No 2 player is injured, the No 3 players moves to No. 2 and No 4 players moves to No 3.
- f. If a player is injured during a match, the match is defaulted but any sets completed could be counted for determining a winner or count back of sets.
- g. The No.1 doubles combination must contain the highest ranked singles player who is playing doubles.
- h. Any one of the five named players (on the original team sheet) may represent the school in this competition).

### 3. Order of play

- a. All singles are to be played before the doubles.
- b. Unless otherwise agreed by team captains, number three and four singles will be played first.

### 4. The winner of the tie shall be:

- a. The winner of the majority of the matches, for example 4-2.
- b. If the matches are tied, the winner of the majority of sets, for example 7-6.
- c. If the matches and sets are tied, the winner of the majority of games, for example 56-54.
- d. If the matches, sets and games are tied, one doubles super tie-breaker will be played with the winner of the tie-breaker being the winner of the tie.

### 5. **Points:**

- a. 1 point awarded for each match won.
- b. 2 bonus points for the winner of the tie.

### 6. Winners: The winner of the tournament shall be:

- a. The team with the most points.
- b. If 2 teams are on equal points, the winner of the tie between the 2 teams.
- c. If 3 or more teams are on equal points, it goes to total matches won minus total matches lost, followed by sets won minus sets lost, followed by games won minus games lost.



# **TENNIS SELF UMPIRING CODE**

New Zealand Tennis has adopted the following policy for self-umpiring of national events:

Matches shall not be umpired and players shall call their own lines. Every player has the right to appeal to the referee who will observe play and may appoint an umpire if necessary. Singles finals and other feature matches should have an umpire who (unless the person is a qualified umpire), will call the score and adjudicate on disputes but the players will continue to call all lines.

### ON-COURT RULES FOR MATCHES PLAYED WIHOUT UMPIRES

- All calls on your side of the net are your responsibility (i.e. you cannot ask an opponent for a let because you do not agree with their call). If you have any doubt as whether a ball is out or good. You should not play a let.
- Any 'out' call must be made instantaneously (i.e. made before either an opponent has hit the return or the return has gone out of play); otherwise, the ball continues in play. The call should be made both verbally and by using the hand signal.
- Do not enlist the aid of spectators, including parents, in making line calls.
- If you call a ball out then realize it was good, you should correct your call.
- To avoid controversy over the score, the Service should announce the set score (e.g. 5-4) before starting a game and the game score (e.g. thirty-forty) prior to serving each point. Game scores should also be recorded on each end change.
- If players cannot agree on the score, they may go back to the last score on which there was agreement and resume play from that point.
- Foot faults are not allowed. If an opponent persists on foot faulting after being warned not to do so the Referee should be informed.
- Do not stall, sulk, complain or practice gamesmanship.
- If a dispute cannot be settled then the player should put his/her racquet down on the court and go and get the referee or tournament manager.

### One of three things will happen:

- a. The official will stay and observe, and if satisfied there is no problem do nothing;
- b. The official will stay and observe, and if necessary, warn an offending player;
- c. The official will appoint a chair umpire.
